Dear Parents and/or Guardians,

In the 2015-2016 school year, Millard Public Schools transitioned away from our emergency response plan known as “Code Red” and “Code Yellow” to a new emergency response procedure called “Standard Response Protocol” (SRP).

Standard Response Protocol is a series of clear, concise actions established to provide consistency in vocabulary and response during an emergency situation. SRP uses four actions: “Lockout”, “Lockdown”, “Shelter in Place” and “Evacuate”. The purpose of this transition is to align our emergency response protocols and procedures with the local law enforcement and other school districts in the Omaha metro area.

Attached to this letter is a parent/guardian guide of these protocols and expectations of both adults and students associated with these practices. Be assured that although the language of such protocols is changing, the actions taken to keep your children safe remain consistent with current practices. Please take a few moments and review the document with your children.

Building administration, faculty, and staff were trained using these protocols. During the first few weeks of school, your student will be taught the processes and procedures of SRP and will be conducting their first "Lockdown" drill using the SRP.
